PSM oxygen plant to be revived at cost of Rs1bn in 3 months: CM

KARACHI: South Chief Minister Syed Murad Ali Shah said on Tuesday that in view of the coronavirus situation, his government would intervene to make oxygen plants operational at Pakistan Steel Mills against a cost of Rs 1 billion.

"We are passing through a very serious situation; therefore, we have to be prepared to face any emergency," said CM in a meeting with the leading doctors at CM House on Tuesday.

The meeting was attended by provincial ministers, Dr Arif Fazal Pechuho, Nasir Shah, Advisor Murad, Chief Secretary, Munirul Haq, PSMC, Sajid Jamal Alvi, VC Dow, Dr Saad Qureshi, Dr Bori, Dr Faizal, Dr Shabir Haq, Executive Director Dr Seemant Jamali, Dr Nasir Shah, Dr Raaj Khelkar, Dr Quaiser Sajjad, Dr Ghaffar Sheeo, Dr Sharif Hashmi, Dr Qazi Wasiq, Dr Anoop, Dr Faizal Mahmood, Dr Sabir

Memon, Dr Abdul Buri and others.

At the outset of the meeting, the chief minister said the new wave of coronavirus had badly affected various major cities of Pakistan.

"We are also facing its severity and trying to take measures whatever seems to be feasible to control the situation," he said and added the purpose of meeting with the leading doctors was to review the situation.

The doctors appreciated the efforts of the chief minister right from the first wave and said the establishment of Infectious Disease Hospital in Karachi, provision of ventilators in every district, and recruitment of doctors and para-medical staff are commendable.

They requested the chief minister to make necessary arrangements for production of oxygen. "When timely oxygen is given to a patient his chances to go to the ventilator are reduced," Dr

Quaiser Sajjad said, adding the provincial government should take necessary measures to make operational oxygen plants of Pakistan Steel Mills.

The chief minister said a team of the federal government had visited Pakistan Steel Mills and reported that it could not be revived.

"We held a meeting with the people of Pakistan Steel Mills with Chairman PPP Bilawal Bhutto and they told us that it could be revived within three months at a cost of Rs 1 billion," he said.

A team of experts would be sent to visit the plant and if it was worth to revive the plant, then the cost was ready to spend Rs 1 billion," said the Chief Minister, adding "We need oxygen for which we would take all our efforts."

The doctors suggested the government to strictly enforce implementation of COVID SOPs. "At present the situation in Sindh is not as bad as it is in other provinces however the situation in Hyderabad, East and South is alarming," they said.

Gusty winds, rain with thunderstorm likely today

KARACHI: The Met Office on Tuesday forecast gusty winds, rain with thunderstorms for spects over in the next 24 hours.

Strong winds, rain with thunderstorm are expected to batter Islamabad, Punjab, Northern Balochistan, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Kashmir and Gilgit-Baltistan.

Hot and dry weather is likely to prevail over the most plain areas of the country during daytime on Wednesday, it said.

"Continental air is prevailing over most parts of the country. Weak moist currents are reaching western and upper parts of the country," the Met said.

In the past 24 hours: weather remained hot and dry in the most plain areas of the country.

But isolated rain fell in Balochistan, Islamabad, Punjab, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and Kashmir.

Bahawalnagar was the hottest place in the country with 43 degrees Celsius of temperature. Shaheed Benazirabad, Mithi 42-each, Naripurthal, Bhakkar, Kot Addu, Rahim Yar Khan, Mohenjo-Daro, Sargodha and Multan 41, each.

KE's system \$650m BQPS-III project to add 900MW of generation capacity: governor

KARACHI: Sindh governor Imran Ismail on Tuesday visited K-Electric's Bin Qasim Power Station-III (BQPS-III) project to review the progress on the latest addition to Karachi's power network.

The visit followed a meeting between KE's senior leadership and the Governor Sindh where KE informed an update on the company's preparedness for Ramazan and the 2021 summer session, said a spokesperson of Governor.

According to the presentation, BQPS-III is a \$650 million project which will add 900 MW of generation capacity to KE's existing network.

Party vice chairman Advocate Syed Hafeezuddin while talking to the media outside the ECP office, said the PSP had submitted evidences of blatant rigging in NA-249 to the ECP and requested for re-poling.

He said in NA-249, the public mandate has been robbed through bullying and rigging. The country needs electoral reforms.

"We have been demanding electoral reforms in the last five years but the political parties in the parliament are not working on electoral reforms to pave the way for them to come to power through rigging", he added.

The high-efficiency plant will be utilizing RLNG as its primary fuel source. Not only is this expected to reduce the carbon footprint,

the inclusion of RLNG will further diversify the company's fuel mix and bring about savings in import costs for the government by eliminating the need for furnace oil.

KE officials were joined by senior representatives from Siemens, SSGC, and PLL who apprised the Governor Sindh of the progress on the construction of a spur pipeline which will be supplying 150mnscf/d of gas to BQPS-III, which is keeping pace with the plant's progress and is also over 90 percent completed.

Underlying Gas Supply Agreement between SSGC and PLL is also in advanced stages and is expected to be finalized as soon as necessary approvals are received from the Government, ensuring an adequate supply of fuel to energize the plant.

Governor Imran Ismail said, "The sincerity of the Government of Pakistan is evident in the support they have extended to KE, and I am pleased to see that Sehr and Iftar times during this Ramazan are exempted from load-shed as a result.

"I'm monitoring the situation regularly to ensure that the best possible facilitation is given to the citizens of Karachi," he said.

KE management and representatives from Siemens, SSGC, and PLL have assured that they are working to complete the project on time, and I have instructed them to remove any bottlenecks that may affect the performance of the plant. In this process, I have also assured them of fullest support from my Government and from the Government of Pakistan.

CEO K-Electric, Mooris Ali said, "We're grateful to the Governor Sindh for his support and participation of Siemens, SSGC, and PLL for visiting BQPS-III.

The timely execution of this project is critical to meet Karachi's future demand, and we are all working around the clock to ensure the same. I also want to thank the Government of Pakistan for their support to KE and Karachi, especially during Ramazan which has enabled us to fully support Karachi's power requirements. We look forward to this support in the upcoming summer months as well."

PM's action to boost expats' confidence: PBIF chief

KARACHI: Chairman of National Business Group of FPCCI and President Pakistan Businessmen and Intellectuals Forum, Mian Zahid Hussain Tuesday said the action of Prime Minister Imran Khan to remove Pakistani ambassador and staff to Saudi Arabia will boost the confidence of overseas Pakistanis.

Prime Minister Imran Khan has taken such strong measure of the negative behaviour of the ambassador and his staff, something that has never happened before and it will send a clear message to diplomats that any lapse in public service delivery will not be tolerated, he said.

Mian Zahid Hussain said that PM has rightly dubbed overseas Pakistanis as an asset and he has always taken personal interest in resolving their problems.

He said that exports are sending \$2.7 billion while imports are \$23 billion but they are not treated well by the staff of Pakistani embassies in many countries, he said.

Exports require considerable investment while there is almost no investment in

embassies who are keeping Pakistan afloat in very difficult situation and their services should be acknowledged, he added.

He noted that migrant workers face insults, bribery and extortions whenever they need to visit the Pakistani embassies which will be stopped as the government has nominated retired

Lieutenant-General Bilal Akbar as Ambassador to KSA.

He will bring a change as his achievements as DG Rangers are widely acknowledged by the people representing all walks of life including the business community.

The treatment meted out to Pakistani citizens by diplomats and staff is in such stark contrast to the accepted norms and standards they act as kings with no regard to the dignity of people or importance of their assignment, he said.

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Petroleum, lubricant sales clock in at 1.67m tons

KARACHI: Total petroleum and lubricant sales clocked in at 1.67 million tons in April 2021, depicting a gigantic growth of 57 percent on year-on-year basis and 13 percent on month-on-month

The growth was due to seasonal factor given higher economic activity in the holy month of Ramazan and low base of April 2020 amid country-wide lockdown last year resulting in a slowdown in sales volumes, analysts said. The growth in sales volume is primarily attributable to economy displaying a remarkable resilience in driving retail sales amid trade activity (exports and imports) and growth in large-scale manufacturing, growth in agriculture output resulting in higher offtake of HSD, massive growth in automobile sales, and strict control on illegal or defused fuel from Iran resulting in higher HSD sales, an analyst at Aarif Habib Limited said.

During the first 10 months of Y21, sale of total petroleum products increased by 19 percent on YoY to 15.83 million tons versus 13.34 million tons in the same period in FY20.

Dissection of data revealed that major contribution to growth came from HSD and FO with offtake undergoing a jump to 6.16 million tons and 2.16 million tons up by 50 percent and 48 percent w

to YoY against 5.15 million tons and 1.68 million tons in the same period last year.

Company-wise, PSO posted the highest growth both on monthly and yearly basis up by 12 percent and 100 percent respectively. Among other listed companies SHEL, APL and BYCO managed to post the nominal growth on monthly and yearly basis.

BYCO recorded a 10 percent growth in HSD sales and continued to post negative growth as company faces liquidity issue resulting in lower sales and decreased market share.

"In coming months we expect MTO and HSD sales continue to post positive growth due to improving economic activities, higher automobile demand and government action on smuggling MTO and HSD," an analyst at Danson Securities said.

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He said KMC will provide all kinds of facilities to such institutions and after the establishment of Health City, the locality of Sakhi Hassan, North Nazimabad, Manghopir, Sirajganj, New Karachi House, Babbu Town, Orangi Town and other adjoining areas
