27 more contract dengue virus in 24 hours

As many as 27 more dengue cases were reported in Rawalpindi during the last 24 hours, raising the tally of confirmed cases to 1,992 in the district. District Coordinator Epidemics Prevention and Control (DCEPC), Dr Sajjad Mehmood, Tuesday said that, among the new cases, ten of each case had arrived from Potohar town urban and Municipal Corporation Rawalpindi area, five from Chaklala Cantonment and one from Gujjar Khan area. He said 101 patients were admitted to district hospitals of which 72 were confirmed cases while 1,919 positive patients were discharged after treatment.

Dr Sajjad informed that the district administration had registered 37 FIRs, issued tickets to 11, sealed one premise, and a fine of Rs 200,500 was imposed against the violations of dengue SOPs during the last 24 hours. During indoor surveillance, in the previous 24 hours, the teams checked 16,759 houses and found larvae in 547 homes. Similarly, he added that while checking 6,352 places, the teams found larvae at 93 sites during outdoor surveillance. He added that district health facilities had allocated 228 beds for dealing with the dengue patients while three admitted patients were in critical condition.

Backlog of unprinted passports reaches 600,000 in Islamabad office

The backlog of unprinted passports has reached 600,000 in an Islamabad passport office as the printing of urgent and normal passports has come to a halt due to the unavailability of the lamination paper which is yet to be imported despite the assurance of the interior ministry. The urgent passports, that are available within a week, could not be printed for two months due to the lack of the lamination paper. People who intend to perform Umrah have also been faced with difficulties due to the passport backlog. Those who intend to go abroad on work visas and the students going

abroad for study have also been faced with difficulties due to the passport backlog. The interior ministry had assured to start the printing of passports on Monday last. The interior minister had also asked the passport director general to resolve the issue immediately. Informed sources have said that the purchase of the lamination paper has been completed, and it is yet to come to Pakistan. The printing of passports will start within 24 hours of receiving the lamination paper. The sources have also said that the passport office is likely to receive the lamination paper within the next 48 hours

PTI chairman's cell in Adiala Jail 'extended'

The cell of incarcerated Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) chairman Imran Khan was extended in Adiala Jail. The PTI chairman requested the special court judge about the extension in his jail cell in Adiala Jail during the last hearing of the case. The jail cell of the PTI chairman has been 'extended' to almost 60 feet from 35 feet on the orders of the special court judge Abu Alhasnat, who is hearing cipher case against the former prime minister in the prison. In today's hearing former chairman Imran Khan and former foreign minister Shah Mahmood Qureshi were to be indicted but the judge deferred their indictment for a week. During today's hearing, the copies of challan in the case were given to the suspects of the cipher case. The former prime minister made two more requests from the judge in today's hearing including for homemade food and a cycle for workouts, the sources said. Judge Hasnat reportedly said the provision of food in jail is the responsibility of jail authorities while he issued a provision of the cycle to the former prime minister as per jail manual.

Unregulated industrially produced Trans-fats in dietary contribute to Pakistan's burgeoning health crisis

For ensuring good health and quality life, it is important to follow healthy practices. One of the contributors to unhealthy lifestyle is use of Trans-fatty acids, which is commonly found in most brands of banaspati ghee, cooking oils, bakery shortenings, bakery ware, processed foods, and several types of snacks such as chocolates, ice-creams, biscuits, etc. This has long been a silent contributor to Pakistan's burgeoning health crisis. The TRANSFORM Pakistan coalition believes that stricter regulations on industrially produced trans-fatty acids (iTFA) content in food products can play a pivotal role in saving lives and enhancing the overall health of the Pakistani nation. According to recent data an estimated \$2640 million was expended on diabetes management only in 2021 in Pakistan. Similarly, if iTFAs are not effectively regulated with other policy actions like reduction in the consumption of sugar and salt in the diet, 62 million Pakistanis are projected to be living with diabetes by 2045. According to the World Health Organization (WHO), high iTFA intake is linked to the huge burden of cardiovascular and other non-communicable diseases (NCDs) in Pakistan. Alarmingly, Pakistan is among the

top countries with the highest iTFA-induced mortality rates. On this World Food Day, the TRANSFORM Pakistan coalition, comprising the Pakistan Youth Change Advocates (PYCA), Center for Peace and Development Initiatives (CPDI), Ministry of National Health Services Regulations and Coordination (MoHSCR), Global Health Advocacy Incubator (GHA), Heart File, and other partners, came together to spotlight the regulation of industrially produced trans-fatty acids (iTFA) in dietary sources. "Recent years have seen some welcome progress. For instance, in 2023, the Pakistan Quality and Standards Control Authority (PSQCA) has placed a mandatory limit of 2 per cent on some major food items including banaspati ghee. However, many food sources still remain uncovered and that is where the challenge lies," stated Afshar Iqbal, spokesperson for PYCA. The TRANSFORM Pakistan coalition is calling upon the PSQCA and food authorities to take swift action in setting limits of iTFAs to no more than 2 percent in all foods across Pakistan. They highlight the successful implementation of similar policies in other countries, such as Denmark, where iTFAs were virtually reduced from food products, resulting in a significant decline in heart diseases.
