Directors' **Report**

Dear Shareholders,

On behalf of the Board of Directors of United Distributors Pakistan Limited (UDPL), we are pleased to present the Unaudited Financial Statements of the Company for the nine months ended March 31, 2025.

INDUSTRY OVERVIEW

During the period under review, the crop protection industry encountered challenging conditions during both Kharif (summer) and Rabi (winter) crop seasons. Key Kharif crops, cotton and rice, suffered significantly due to abnormal heatwave, erratic monsoon patterns, and a decline in farmers' purchasing power, driven by suppressed wheat prices. Consequently, demand for agri-inputs remained subdued.

In the Rabi season, sentiment among farmers remained cautious, especially for wheat, as no official support price was announced. Crop input purchases were therefore confined to essential requirements. Additionally, prolonged dry weather from November through February adversely affected wheat yields.

On a more positive note, a stable exchange rate and declining interest rates have improved cost management and profit margins for businesses.

The Company recorded revenue of Rs. 743 million for the nine months ended March 31, 2025, showing resilience despite challenges faced across the industry. Although this reflects a 5.1% decline compared to the same period last year, the Company stayed focused on improving efficiency and managing costs. Gross profit stood at Rs. 280 million, with a healthy gross margin of 38%, showing control over cost pressures. Operating profit was affected by rising inflation-related costs, but initiatives are being taken to improve profitability and build long-term value for shareholders.

The Company reported a strong Profit After Tax of Rs. 817 million, significantly higher than Rs. 94 million in the same period last year, mainly due to other income. As a result, earnings per share (EPS) rose to Rs. 2316, up from Rs. 2.66.

During the period, the Company sold 1,639,420 ordinary shares—representing 40% of its total shareholding in FMC United (Private) Limited. The gain from this divestment was recorded under other income and contributed positively to overall profitability.

The Board of Directors is pleased to announce an interim cash dividend of Rs. 1.25 per share for the quarter ended March 31, 2025.

FUTURE OUTLOOK

With a stable exchange rate, declining policy rates, and controlled general inflation, the domestic economy is expected to continue on a path of stabilization. Sustainable agricultural growth depends on consistent government policies that provide affordable farm inputs, ready markets for produce at support prices, availability of water and effective climate control measures.

The Company remains confident and focused on mitigating challenges by leveraging its diversified product portfolio and growth plan, aiming to deliver top-quartile results aligned with its core commitment to delivering lasting value to stakeholders.

1 STATUS AND NATURE OF BUSINESS

United Distributors Pakistan Limited (UDPL) ("the Company") was incorporated in Pakistan on July 01, 1981, under the repealed Companies Act, 1913 & Companies Ordinance, 1984 (now the Companies Act, 2017), as a public company limited by shares, and it's shares are listed on the Pakistan Stock Exchange (PSX). The principal activity of the Company is manufacturing, trading, and distribution of pesticides, fertilizers, and other allied products.

The Company is a subsidiary of Genesis Holding (Private) Limited, (the Parent). The Parent Company holds 85.2% of the Company's shares.

3 BASIS OF PREPARATION

3.1 Statement of compliance

These condensed interim financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting and reporting standards applicable in Pakistan for interim financial reporting. The accounting and reporting standards applicable in Pakistan for interim financial reporting comprise of :

- (a) International Accounting Standard (IAS) 34, Interim Financial Reporting, issued by the International Accounting Standard Board (IASB) as notified under the Companies Act, 2017 and
 - Provisions of and directives issued under the Companies Act, 2017.
- (b) Where the provisions of and directives issued under the Companies Act, 2017, differ from the requirements of IAS 34, the provisions of and directives issued under the Companies Act, 2017, have been followed.

These condensed interim financial statements are unaudited and subject to the limited scope review by auditor and is being submitted to the members as required under Section 237 of the Companies Act, 2017, and the listing regulations of the Pakistan Stock Exchange.

These condensed interim financial statements do not include all the information and disclosures required for full annual financial statements and should be read in conjunction with the annual financial statements of the Company as at, and for the year ended, June 30, 2024, which have been prepared in accordance with approved accounting standards as applicable in Pakistan. However, selected explanatory notes are included to explain events and transactions that are material to understanding of the changes in the Company's financial position and performance since the last annual audited financial statements.

The comparative statement of financial position presented in these condensed interim financial statements has been extracted from the annual audited financial statements of the Company for the year ended June 30, 2024, whereas the comparative condensed interim statement of profit or loss, condensed interim statement of comprehensive income, condensed interim statement of cash flows, and condensed interim statement of changes in equity are extracted from the unaudited condensed interim financial information for the period ended March 31, 2024.

The figures of the condensed interim statement of profit or loss and condensed statement of comprehensive income for the nine months ended March 31, 2025 and March 31, 2024 included in these condensed interim financial statements were neither subject to review nor audited.

3.2 Basis of measurement

These condensed interim financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention except otherwise stated.

3.3 Functional and presentation currency

These condensed interim financial statements has been presented in Pak Rupees (Rupees 'Rs'), which is the functional and presentation currency of the Company.

4 MATERIAL ACCOUNTING POLICY INFORMATION AND CHANGES THERE IN

- 4.1 The accounting policies and the methods of computation adopted in the preparation of these condensed interim financial statements are consistent with those applied in the preparation of the audited financial statements for the year ended June 30, 2024.
- 4.2 Change in accounting standards, interpretations and amendments to published accounting and reporting standards

4.2.1 Amendments to published accounting and reporting standards which became effective during the period:

Certain standards, amendments and interpretations to approved accounting standards are effective for annual accounting periods beginning on January 01, 2024, but are considered not to be relevant or did not have any significant effect on the Company's operations and are, therefore, not detailed in these condensed interim financial statements.

4.2.2 Standards, amendments and interpretations to existing standards that are not yet effective and have not been early adopted by the Company:

There are certain standards, amendments to the accounting standards and interpretations that are mandatory for the Company's annual accounting periods beginning on or after January 1, 2025, but are considered not to be relevant or expected to have any significant effect on the Company's operations and are, therefore, not detailed in these condensed interim financial statements.

5 SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING ESTIMATES, JUDGEMENTS, AND ASSUMPTIONS

The preparation of these condensed interim financial statements in conformity with accounting and reporting standards applicable in pakistan requires management to make estimates, assumptions and use judgments that affect the application of policies and the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses.

Actual result may differ from these estimates. Estimates, assumptions and judgements are continually evaluated and are based on historical experience and other factors, including reasonable expectations of future events. During the preparation of these condensed interim financial statements, the significant judgements made by the management in applying the Company's accounting policies and the key sources of estimation uncertainty were the same as those applied to the annual financial statements for the year ended June 30, 2024.

18.1 Financial risk factors

The Company's activities expose it to a variety of financial risks: market risk (including currency risk, interest rate risk and other price risk), credit risk and liquidity risk.

صنعت کا جائزہ

زیر غور مدت کے دوران فصل وں کے تحفظ کی صنعت کو خریف (موسم گرما) اور ربیع (موسم سرما) دونوں فصلوں کے موسم وں کے دوران مشکل حالات کا سامنا کرنا پڑا۔ خریف کی اہم فصلوں، کپاس اور چاول کو غیر معمولی ہیٹ ویو، مون سون کے بے ترتیب پیٹرن اور گندم کی قیمتوں میں کمی کی وجہ سے کسانوں کی قوت خرید میں کمی کی وجہ سے کافی نقصان اٹھانا پڑا۔ نتیجتا، زرعی ان پٹ کی مانگ کم رہی۔

ربیع سیزن میں کسانوں کے جذبات خاص طور پر گندم کے حوالے سے محتاط رہے کیونکہ سرکاری امدادی قیمت کا اعلان نہیں کیا گیا تھا۔ لہذا فصل کی ان پٹ خریداری ضروری ضروریات تک محدود تھی۔ مزید برآں نومبر سے فروری تک طویل خشک موسم نے گندم کی پیداوار کو بری طرح متاثر کیا۔

زیادہ مثبت نوٹ پر ، مستحکم شرح تبادلہ اور شرح سود میں کمی نے کاروباری اداروں کے لئے لاگت کے انتظام اور منافع کے مارجن کو بہتر بنایا ہے۔

کمپنی نے 31 مارچ 2025ء کو ختم ہونے والے نو ماہ کے دوران 743 ملین روپے کی آمدنی ریکارڈ کی جو صنعت بھر میں درپیش چیلنجز کے باوجود لچک کا مظاہرہ کرتی ہے۔ اگرچہ یہ گزشتہ سال کے اسی عرصے کے مقابلے میں 5.1 فیصد کمی کی عکاسی کرتا ہے ، لیکن کمپنی نے کارکردگی کو بہتر بنانے اور اخراجات کے انتظام پر توجہ مرکوز رکھی۔ مجموعی منافع 280 ملین روپے رہا ، جس میں مجموعی مارجن 38٪ تھا ، جو لاگت کے دباؤ پر قابو کو ظاہر

کرتا ہے۔ آپریٹنگ منافع افراط زر سے متعلق بڑھتے ہوئے اخراجات سے متاثر ہوا تھا ، لیکن منافع کو بہتر بنانے اور شیئر ہولڈرز کے لئے طویل مدتی قدر بنانے کے لئے اقدامات کیے جارہے ہیں۔

کمپنی اپنے متنوع پروڈکٹ پورٹ فولیو اور گروتھ پلان سے فائدہ اٹھاتے ہوئے چیلنجز کو کم کرنے پر پراعتماد اور توجہ مرکوز کیے ہوئے ہے، جس کا مقصد اسٹیک ہولڈرز کو دیرپا قدر فراہم کرنے کے اپنے بنیادی عزم کے مطابق ٹاپ کوارٹائل نتائج فراہم کرنا ہے۔
