DIRECTORS' REVIEW

The Board of Directors of Sitara Energy Limited (the Company) is pleased to present their report together with the Condensed Interim Financial Information and its subsidiary for the 3rd quarter ended on March 31, 2026.

Operational Financial Results:

The financial results for nine (9) months of the current financial year as compared with nine (9) months of the last financial year are as under: -

The sales revenue of the Company decreased to Rs. 19.226 million during nine (9) months of current financial year in comparison with Rs. 168.958 million during corresponding nine (9) months of last financial year due to lower demand and generation. Accordingly, the Company incurred gross loss Rs 15.890 million during nine (9) months of current financial year as compared with gross loss Rs 29.491 million during corresponding nine (9) months of last financial year.

Finance cost reduced to Rs 37.513 million during the nine (9) months of the current financial year as compared with Rs 60.105 million during the nine (9) months of the last financial year as a result of regular repayments of rescheduled financing facilities at cost of fund. The company earned other income of Rs. 183.160 million on disposal of non-core assets for the repayment of rescheduled financing facilities. Resultantly, the Company earned profit for the period (after tax) Rs. 63.188 million during the nine (9) months of the current financial year in comparison with loss for the period (after tax) Rs. 121.694 million during the nine (9) months of the last financial year. Earning per share is Rs 3.31 during the nine (9) months of the current financial year in comparison with loss per share of Rs 6.37 during the nine (9) months of the last financial year.

The viability of the company still depends upon load demand and viable generation cost. Moreover, the Company envisaged adding solar power for sustainable operation in the long run.

We extend our heartiest gratitude to all our lenders, suppliers and dedicated staff for their continuous support in difficult time in the supreme interest of the Company.

NOTES TO THE CONDENSED INTERIM FINANCIAL STATEMENTS (UN-AUDITED)

FOR THE NINE MONTHS ENDED MARCH 31, 2026

1. STATUS AND ACTIVITIES

- 1.1 Sitara Energy Limited (the Company) is incorporated in Pakistan as a public limited Company under the Companies Ordinance, 1984 (Repealed with the enactment of the Companies Act 2017 on May 30, 2017) and is listed on Pakistan stock exchange. The main object of the Company is generation and distribution of electricity. The registered office of the Company is situated at 601-602 Business Centre, Mumtaz Hasan Road, Karachi in the province of Sindh. The project is located at Tehsil Jaranwala, District Faisalabad in the province of Punjab.
- 1.2 These condensed interim financial statements are presented in Pak Rupee, which is the Company's functional and presentation currency.
- 1.3 The Company has incurred losses in prior periods and production and sale of electricity have significantly reduced as the production from generators remained temporarily suspended due to higher fuel prices.

However, the company is installing solar power plant to change the energy mix and produce electricity at a cheaper cost.

Other positive steps taken by the management and their impact is as under:

- In order to reduce burden of finance cost, the company's request to restructure /reschedule its credit facilities at cost of funds has been approved by the banks and repayments are being made as per the terms and conditions of the Settlement Agreements. The financial burden of the company will be considerably reduced as a result of restructuring.
- The management is trying its best to dispose off non-core assets such as investment properties and use the proceeds in operations. The company will be enhancing solar power plant capacity in the coming years through disposal proceeds of investment properties to make the operations of the project viable. The government policies are also supportive for renewable energy.

All these factors indicate that the company will continue as a going concern.

2. BASIS OF PREPARATION

2.1 Statement of compliance

2.1.1 These condensed interim financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting and reporting standards as applicable in Pakistan for interim financial reporting. The accounting and reporting standards as applicable in Pakistan for interim financial reporting comprise of :

- International Accounting Standard (IAS) 34, issued by the International Accounting Standards Board (IASB) as notified under the Companies Act, 2017; and
- Provisions of and directives issued under the Companies Act, 2017

Where the provisions of and directives issued under the Companies Act, 2017 differ with the requirements of IAS 34, the provisions of and directives issued under the Companies Act, 2017 have been followed.

2.1.2 These condensed interim financial statements are unaudited but subject to limited scope review by the auditors, as required under section 237 of Companies Act, 2017 and should be read in conjunction with published audited annual financial statements of the company for the year ended June 30, 2025.

2.1.3 These condensed interim financial statements do not include all the information required for complete set of financial statements, and should be read in conjunction with the Company's published annual audited financial statements for the year ended June 30, 2025.

2.2 Application of new and revised International Financial Reporting Standards

2.2.1 Standards, amendments to standards and interpretations becoming effective in current period

There are certain new standards, interpretations and amendments to approved accounting standards which are mandatory for the Company's accounting periods beginning on or after July 1, 2025 but are considered not to be relevant or have any significant effect on the Company's financial reporting.

2.2.2 Standards, amendments to standards and interpretations becoming effective in future periods

There are other new standards, amendments and IFRIC interpretations that are mandatory for accounting periods of the Company beginning on or after July 01, 2026 but are considered not to be relevant or not to have any significant effect on the company's operations. The new standards, amendments and IFRIC interpretations that are relevant to the operations of the Company are disclosed in the published audited annual financial statements for the year ended June 30, 2025.

2.3 Basis of measurement

These condensed interim financial statements have been prepared under the "historical cost convention" except short term investments valued at fair value through profit or loss.

2.4 Accounting policies and methods of computation

The material accounting policies information and methods of computation adopted in the preparation of these condensed interim financial statements are the same as those applied in the preparation of the published audited annual financial statements for the year ended June 30, 2025.

2.5 Estimates, judgments and risk management policies

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with approved accounting standards, as applicable in Pakistan, requires the management to make judgments, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses.

The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and various other factors that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances, the results of which form the basis of making the judgments about the carrying values of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

Significant areas of estimation uncertainty and critical judgments in applying accounting policies that have the most significant effect on amounts recognized in these condensed interim financial statements are the same as those disclosed in the published audited annual financial statements for the year ended June 30, 2025.

2.6 Risk management policies and procedures are consistent with those disclosed in the published audited annual financial statements for the year ended June 30, 2025.

3.1 It represents the re-structuring of short term - term finance in 2023. It is secured against first exclusive charge over fixed assets of the Company. It is further secured against first joint charge over current assets of the company ranking pari passu with the charges created in respect of other long term financing and short term borrowings and also by personal guarantee of chief executive of the Company.

It is subject to mark up at the fixed rate of 4.76% per annum (June 2025: 4.76% per annum). Interest/markup past due till the date of re-structuring, along with future accrued markup is repayable in four equal quarterly installments commencing from March 31, 2026 and ending on December 31, 2026.

3.2 It represents the re-structuring of short term - running finance in 2024. It is secured against specific charge over investment property owned by the Company and its wholly owned subsidiary. It is further secured against first joint charge over current assets of the Company ranking pari passu with the charges created in respect of other long term financing and short term borrowings, first ranking charge over fixed assets, and by personal guarantees of two directors of the Company.

It is subject to markup at cost of funds. Interest/markup past due till the date of re-structuring, along with future accrued markup is repayable in four equal quarterly installments commencing from June 30, 2027 and ending on March 31, 2028.

Effective rate of mark up charged during the period was 16.51% per annum (June 2025: 10.80 % per annum).

3.3 It represents the re-structuring of short term - morabaha finance-I and running finance in 2024. It is secured against first joint charge over current assets of the Company ranking pari passu with the charges created in respect of other long term financing and short term borrowings. It is further secured against first joint charge over fixed assets of the Company ranking pari passu with the charges created in respect of short term borrowings and by personal guarantees of two directors of the Company.

It is subject to markup at cost of funds. Interest/markup past due till the date of re-structuring, along with future accrued markup is repayable in two equal quarterly installments commencing from September 15, 2028 and ending on December 15, 2028.

Effective rate of mark up charged durind the period was 12.83% per annum (June 2025: 4.76% to 17.26% per annum).

3.4 Overdue Installments

As at period end , the installments of principals amounting to Rs. 51.412 million were over due.

1. GROUP STATUS AND ACTIVITIES

- 1.1** The Group consists of Sitara Energy Limited (the Parent) and Sitara International (Private) Limited (the wholly owned Subsidiary).

The parent is incorporated in Pakistan as a public limited company under the repealed Companies Ordinance, 1984 (Repealed with the enactment of the Companies Act 2017 on May 30, 2017) and is listed on Pakistan Stock Exchange Limited. The main object of the Parent is generation and distribution of electricity. The registered office of the Parent is situated at 601-602 Business Centre, Mumtaz Hasan Road, Karachi, in the province of Sindh. The project is located at Tehsil Jaranwala, District Faisalabad in the province of Punjab.

The subsidiary is incorporated in Pakistan as a private limited company under the repealed Companies Ordinance, 1984 (Repealed with the enactment of the Companies Act 2017 on May 30, 2017). The principal activity of the Subsidiary is trading in real estate business. The registered office of the Subsidiary is situated at 601-602 Business Centre, Mumtaz Hasan Road, Karachi, in the province of Sindh.

- 1.2** These consolidated condensed interim financial statements are presented in Pak Rupee, which is the group's functional and presentation currency.
- 1.3** The Group has incurred losses in prior periods and production and sale of electricity have significantly reduced as the production from generators remained temporarily suspended due to higher fuel prices.

These events and conditions indicate a material uncertainty that may cast significant doubt on the Group's ability to continue as a going concern and therefore, the Group may not be able to realize its assets and discharge its liabilities in the normal course of business.

The Parent Company has formulated a multi faceted plan and is taking measures to address these adverse factors. These are briefly discussed below;

- the Parent Company is installing solar power plant to produce electricity at competitive tariff to increase its turnover and improve its operating results;
- the Parent Company is hopeful that the available production capacity will be used in near future on the implementation of Competitive Trading Bilateral Contract Market by the Government as approved by NEPRA and fuel prices may also reduce in future as a result of decreasing demand of fossil fuels, resulting in improved generation and sales of electricity at reasonable profit margin;
- the Parent Company has also entered into agreements with all of its lenders, resulting in conversion of short term finances into long term finances, with pricing at cost of funds of the lenders. As a result, the finance cost is reducing from quarter to quarter and year to year moving the company towards sustainable operations in due course of time;
- the Parent Company is also making all efforts to dispose of non-core assets including investment properties to repay/prepay credit facilities and to further install solar plant which will result in improved sales and profitability; During the period, the Parent Company has disposed off investment properties at a consideration of Rs. 176.21 million (June 30 ,2025: Rs. 213.96 million).

The management is committed to implement its plan that will bring the Group back on track and hence, the management is confident that the Group will continue as a going concern.

2. BASIS OF CONSOLIDATION

These condensed interim consolidated financial statements includes the condensed interim financial statements of Sitara Energy Limited and its subsidiary Sitara International (Private) Limited. The condensed interim consolidated financial statements of the parent and subsidiary are combined on a line by line basis.

All intra-company balances, transactions and resulting unrealised profits, if any, are eliminated.

3. BASIS OF PREPARATION

3.1 Statement of compliance

3.1.1 These condensed interim consolidated financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting and reporting standards as applicable in Pakistan for interim financial reporting. The accounting and reporting standards as applicable in Pakistan for interim financial reporting comprise of :

- International Accounting Standard (IAS) 34, issued by the International Accounting Standards Board (IASB) as notified under the Companies Act, 2017; and
- Provisions of, directives and notifications issued under the Companies Act, 2017.

3.1.2 Where the provisions of, directives and notifications issued under the Companies Act, 2017 differ with the requirements of IAS 34, the provisions of, directives and notifications issued under the Companies Act, 2017 have been followed.

3.1.3 These condensed interim consolidated financial statements are unaudited but subject to limited scope review by the auditors, as required under section 237 of Companies Act, 2017 and should be read in conjunction with published annual audited consolidated annual financial statements of the Group for the year ended June 30, 2025.

3.1.4 These condensed interim consolidated financial statements do not include all the information required for complete set of consolidated financial statements, and should be read in conjunction with the Group's published annual audited consolidated financial statements for the year ended June 30, 2025.

3.2 Application of new and revised International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRSs)

3.2.1 Standards, amendments to standards and interpretations becoming effective in current period

There are certain new standards, interpretations and amendments to approved accounting standards which are mandatory for the Company's accounting periods beginning on or after July 1, 2025 but are considered not to be relevant or have any significant effect on the Group's financial reporting.

3.2.2 Standards, amendments to standards and interpretations becoming effective in future periods

There are other new standards, amendments and IFRIC interpretations that are mandatory for accounting periods of the company beginning on or after July 01, 2026 but are considered not to be relevant or not to have any significant effect on the company's operations. The new standards, amendments and IFRIC interpretations that are relevant to the operations of the company are disclosed in the published audited annual consolidated financial statements for the year ended June 30, 2025.

3.3 Basis of measurement

These condensed interim consolidated financial statements have been prepared under the "historical cost convention" except:

- short term investments valued at fair value through profit or loss.

3.4 Accounting policies and methods of computation

The material accounting policies information and methods of computation adopted in the preparation of these condensed interim consolidated financial statements are the same as those applied in the preparation of the published audited annual consolidated financial statements for the year ended June 30, 2025.

3.5 Estimates, judgments and risk management policies

The preparation of these condensed interim consolidated financial statements in conformity with approved accounting standards, as applicable in Pakistan, requires the management to make judgments, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses.

The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and various other factors that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances, the results of which form the basis of making the judgments about the carrying values of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

Significant areas of estimation uncertainty and critical judgments in applying accounting policies that have the most significant effect on amounts recognized in these condensed interim consolidated financial statements are the same as those disclosed in the published audited annual consolidated financial statements for the year ended June 30, 2025.

3.6 Risk management policies and procedures are consistent with those disclosed in the published audited annual consolidated financial statements for the year ended June 30, 2025.

4.1 It represents the re-structuring of short term - term finance in 2023. It is secured against first exclusive charge over fixed assets of the Company. It is further secured against first joint charge over current assets of the company ranking pari passu with the charges created in respect of other long term financing and short term borrowings and also by personal guarantee of chief executive of the Company.

It is subject to mark up at the fixed rate of 4.76% per annum (June 2025: 4.76% per annum). Interest/markup past due till the date of re-structuring, along with future accrued markup is repayable in four equal quarterly installments commencing from March 31, 2026 and ending on December 31, 2026.

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4.2 It represents the re-structuring of short term - running finance in 2024. It is secured against specific charge over investment property owned by the Company and its wholly owned subsidiary. It is further secured against first joint charge over current assets of the Company ranking pari passu with the charges created in respect of other long term financing and short term borrowings, first ranking charge over fixed assets, and by personal guarantees of two directors of the Company.

It is subject to markup at cost of funds. Interest/markup past due till the date of re-structuring, along with future accrued markup is repayable in four equal quarterly installments commencing from June 30, 2027 and ending on March 31, 2028.

Effective rate of mark up charged during the period was 16.51% per annum (June 2025: 10.80 % per annum).

4.3 It represents the re-structuring of short term - morabaha finance-I and running finance in 2024. It is secured against first joint charge over current assets of the Company ranking pari passu with the charges created in respect of other long term financing and short term borrowings. It is further secured against first joint charge over fixed assets of the Company ranking pari passu with the charges created in respect of short term borrowings and by personal guarantees of two directors of the Company.

It is subject to markup at cost of funds. Interest/markup past due till the date of re-structuring, along with future accrued markup is repayable in two equal quarterly installments commencing from September 15, 2028 and ending on December 15, 2028.

Effective rate of mark up charged during the period was 12.83% per annum (June 2025: 4.76% to 17.26% per annum).

4.4 Overdue Installments

As at period end , the installments of principals amounting to Rs. 51.412 million were over due.
