Brief Comments on current period performance

The crushing season in 2026 remained challenging, as sugarcane prices continued to rise throughout the season. At the same time, surplus sugar production in the country placed downward pressure on sugar prices. As a result, revenue margins came under strain while procurement costs increased, creating an unfavourable margin gap.

However, the Company prudently sold a substantial portion of its inventory at favourable prices, which helped support profitability. Operationally, the Company performed well, processing 48% more sugarcane compared to last season. The distillery plant also operated for 33 additional days compared with the previous year's first half.

Nevertheless, the distillery segment remained under pressure due to stagnant ethanol prices and high molasses costs. Overall profitability, therefore, remained constrained. Despite these challenges, the gross margin for the current half year improved to 7%, compared with 6% in the corresponding period last year.

Finance costs increased by 39% during the period. However, through effective management and operational discipline, the Company was still able to achieve earnings per share of PKR 6.61.

Future Outlook

Surplus sugar production has led to a significant decline in sugar prices. The Government has been requested to allow the export of surplus sugar; however, approval is still awaited. International sugar prices also remain unattractive at present.

Meanwhile, inflationary pressures continue, and the State Bank of Pakistan has increased its policy rate by 1%, further raising the cost of doing business. If the conflict in the Middle East continues, it may also have an adverse impact on businesses in Pakistan.

Ethanol prices are not expected to improve in the near term. Accordingly, the distillery segment is likely to remain under pressure. Despite these challenging circumstances, the management remains confident that the Company will continue to perform well in a competitive market environment.

INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REVIEW REPORT

To the Members of Noon Sugar Mills Limited
Report on Review of Interim Financial Statements

Introduction

We have reviewed the accompanying condensed interim statement of financial position of Noon Sugar Mills Limited as at March 31, 2026 and the related condensed interim statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income, condensed interim statement of changes in equity, and condensed interim statement of cash flows, and notes to the financial statements for the six months period then ended (here-in-after referred to as the "interim financial statements"). Management is responsible for the preparation and presentation of these interim financial statements in accordance with accounting and reporting standards as applicable in Pakistan for interim financial reporting. Our responsibility is to express a conclusion on these interim financial statements based on our review.

Scope of Review

We conducted our review in accordance with International Standard on Review Engagements 2410, "Review of Interim Financial Information Performed by the Independent Auditor of the Entity". A review of interim financial statements consists of making inquiries, primarily of persons responsible for financial and accounting matters, and applying analytical and other review procedures. A review is substantially less in scope than an audit conducted in accordance with International Standards on Auditing and consequently does not enable us to obtain assurance that we would become aware of all significant matters that might be identified in an audit. Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion.

Conclusion

Based on our review, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the accompanying interim financial statements are not prepared, in all material respects, in accordance with the accounting and reporting standards as applicable in Pakistan for interim financial reporting.

Other matter

Pursuant to requirement of Section 237 (1) (b) of the Companies Act, 2017, only cumulative figures for the half-year, presented in the second quarter accounts are subject to a limited scope review by the statutory auditors of the Company. Accordingly, the figures of the condensed interim statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income for the quarter ended March 31, 2026 and March 31, 2025 have not been reviewed by us.

NOTES TO THE CONDENSED INTERIM FINANCIAL STATEMENTS (UN-AUDITED)

FOR THE SIX MONTHS PERIOD ENDED MARCH 31, 2026

1. LEGAL STATUS AND NATURE OF BUSINESS

Noon Sugar Mills Limited (the Company) was incorporated in the year 1964 as a Public Company and its shares are quoted on the Pakistan Stock Exchange. The principal activity of the Company is manufacturing and sale of white sugar and spirit.

Geographical location and addresses of major business units including mills / plant of the Company are as under:

2. BASIS OF PREPARATION

2.1 Statement of compliance

These condensed interim financial statements (the interim financial statements) have been prepared in accordance with the accounting and reporting standards as applicable in Pakistan for interim financial reporting. The accounting and reporting standards as applicable in Pakistan for interim financial reporting comprise of:

- International Accounting Standard (IAS) 34, (Interim financial reporting), issued by the International Accounting Standards Board (IASB) as notified under the Companies Act, 2017 (the Act);
- Islamic Financial Accounting Standards (IFASs) issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Pakistan as notified under the Act; and
- Provisions of, directives and notifications issued under the Act.

Where the provisions of, directives and notifications issued under the Act differ with the requirements of IAS 34, the provisions of, directives and notifications issued under the Act have been followed.

2.2 These interim financial statements do not include all of the information required for annual financial statements and should be read in conjunction with the annual audited financial statements of the Company as at and for the year ended September 30, 2025. Selected explanatory notes are included to explain events and transactions that are significant to the understanding of the changes in the Company's financial position and performance since the last annual audited financial statements.

2.3 These interim financial statements are un-audited and are being submitted to the members as required by section 237 of the Act. The figures for the six months period ended March 31, 2026 have, however, been subjected to limited scope review by the external Auditors.

2.4 Basis of measurement

These interim financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention except for staff retirement benefits (gratuity), which are stated at their present value.

2.5 Functional and presentation currency

These interim financial statements are presented in Pak Rupees, which is also the Company's functional currency. All amounts have been rounded to the nearest thousand, unless otherwise stated.

3. Material accounting policies

The material accounting policies applied in the preparation of these interim financial statements are the same as those applied in the preparation of the financial statements of the Company for the year ended September 30, 2025.

4. Changes In accounting standards, interpretations and pronouncements

4.1 Standards, amendments and interpretations to accounting standards that are effective in the current period

Certain standards, amendments and interpretations to International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRSs) are effective for accounting period beginning on October 01, 2025, but are considered not to be relevant or to have any significant effect on the Company's operations (although they may affect the accounting for future transactions and events) and are, therefore, not detailed in these interim financial statements.

4.2 Standards, amendments and interpretations to existing standards that are not yet effective and have not been early adopted by the Company

There are certain standards, amendments to the accounting standards and interpretations that are mandatory for the Company's accounting periods beginning on or after October 01, 2026, but are considered not to be relevant or to have any significant effect on the Company's operations and are, therefore, not detailed in these interim financial statements.

5. Accounting estimates and judgements

The preparation of these interim financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, income and expenses. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

In preparing these interim financial statements, the significant judgements made by management in applying the Company's accounting policies and the key sources of estimation uncertainty were the same as those applied to the financial statements for the year ended September 30, 2025.

6. Seasonality of operations

The Company is inter-alia engaged in manufacturing of sugar for which the season begins in November / December and ends in March / April. Therefore, majority of expenses are incurred and production activities are undertaken in the first half of the Company's financial year thus increasing volume of inventories, trade payables and borrowings at the end of first half.

7.1 These finances have been obtained against a demand finance facility of Rs.500 million to finance BMR activity pertaining to installation of boiler and turbine for the sugar division. This finance facility carries mark-up at the rate of 1 month KIBOR + 1.75% per annum; effective mark-up rates charged by MCB, during the current period, ranged from 12.25% to 13.14% (September 30, 2025: 12.91% to 19.47%) per annum.

7.2 These finances have been obtained against a term finance facility of Rs.1,000 million to partially refinance the capital expenditure incurred during the financial years 2023 and 2024. This finance facility carries mark-up at the rate of 3 months KIBOR + 2.5% per annum; effective mark-up rates charged by UBL, during the period, ranged from 13.13% to 13.84% (September 30, 2025: 13.65% to 14.73%) per annum.

9.1 (a) Short term finance facilities available from various commercial banks under mark-up arrangements aggregate to Rs.12.090 billion (September 30, 2025: Rs.7.990 billion). These finance facilities, during the period, carried mark-up at the rates ranging from 4.50% to 14.85% (September 30, 2025: 8.00% to 19.64%) per

annum. Facilities available for opening letters of credit and guarantee aggregate to Rs.130.820 million (September 30, 2025: Rs.130.820 million) of which facilities aggregating Rs.115.108 million (September 30, 2025: Rs.115.108 million) remained unutilised at the reporting date. These facilities are expiring on various dates by February, 2027.

- 9.1 (b) Certain financial covenants for short term finance facilities were not complied with during the current period. The management, however, has taken a number of steps in this regard and is confident that necessary compliances will be ensured in the foreseeable future.

- The Appellate Tribunal Inland Revenue, vide its order dated March 02, 2026, has cancelled the order of the Tax Department and vacated the demands aggregating Rs.82.069 million raised by the Tax Department for the tax year 2019 under section 161 of the Income Tax Ordinance, 2001.

موجودہ مدت کی کارکردگی پر مختصر تبصرہ

سال 2026 کا کرٹیکل یزن مشکل رہا کیونکہ گنے کی قیمتوں میں مسلسل اضافہ ہو رہا ہے۔ ملک میں پھٹی کی اضافی پیداوار کے باعث پھٹی کی قیمتوں پر دباؤ زیادہ ہو گیا ہے۔ نتیجتاً آمدنی کا بھاری بھارہ ہو گیا ہے۔ اگرچہ خریداری کے اخراجات میں اضافہ ہوا ہے جس سے منافع کے مارجن پر وقتی اثر پڑا ہے تاہم کمپنی نے دائمی سے اپنے قابل ذکر ذخیرے کو مناسب قیمتوں پر فروخت کیا جس نے منافع میں معاونت فراہم کی۔

آپریٹنگ کے شعبے میں کمپنی نے غیر معمولی کارکردگی کا مظاہرہ کرتے ہوئے گزشتہ سال کے مقابلے میں 4B فیصد زیادہ گنے کی پروسیسنگ کی۔ ڈیٹری پلانٹ ابھی گزشتہ سال کے پہلے نصف کے مقابلے میں 33 دن زیادہ چلا گیا تاہم یہ شعبہ وہاں سالانہ اہم کی حیثیت سے کارکردگی اور شیرے (Molasses) کی بلند لاگت کے باعث مشکلات سے دوچار رہا۔ اسی وجہ سے مجموعی منافع میں خاطر خواہ بہتری نہ آسکی۔

تاہم موجودہ ششماہی کے دوران مجموعی منافع کا مارجن 7 فیصد رہا جو تاریخی مدت میں 6 فیصد تھا۔ موجودہ ششماہی میں مالیاتی اخراجات میں 39 فیصد اضافہ ہوا۔ اس کے باوجود مشکل حالات میں بھی کمپنی نے بہتر اہتمامی صلاحیتوں کے ذریعے فی حصص آمدنی (EPS) 6.61 روپے حاصل کی۔

مستقبل کا منظر نامہ

پھٹی کی اضافی پیداوار کے باعث قیمتوں میں نمایاں کمی واقع ہوئی۔ حکومت سے درخواست کی گئی ہے کہ اضافی پھٹی کی برآمد کی اجازت دی جائے۔ تاہم اس سلسلے میں اجازت کا اچھی اظہار ہے۔ دوسری جانب اس وقت عالمی منڈی میں پھٹی کی قیمتیں بھی زیادہ پرکشش نہیں ہیں۔

بصرہ میٹال کی شرح میں مسلسل اضافہ ہو رہا ہے اور اسٹیٹ بینک آف پاکستان نے اپنی پالیسی شرح سود میں ایک فیصد اضافہ کر دیا ہے۔ کاروبار کرنے کی لاگت ہر سال بڑھتی جا رہی ہے۔ مشرق وسطیٰ میں جاری تنازع اگر طویل ہوا تو اس کے پاکستان میں کاروباری سرگرمیوں پر بھی وقتی اثرات مرتب ہونے کا خدشہ ہے۔

بڑھتی ہوئی قیمتوں میں اضافے کی توقع نہیں ہے، لہذا ڈیٹری کا شعبہ مشکل حالات کا سامنا کرتا رہے گا۔ ان تمام دشوار حالات کے باوجود انتظامیہ کو یقین ہے کہ کمپنی مناسب بائیں بائیں کارکردگی دکھائے گی۔
