The Board of Directors of your Company is pleased to present unaudited condensed interim financial statements for the half year ended December 31, 2024 in compliance with the requirements of section 237 of the Companies Act, 2017 and code of corporate governance issued by Securities and Exchange Commission of Pakistan.

### **Economic & Industrial Overview**

Due to ongoing economic pressures, challenges faced by Pakistan's economy continued impacting the Pakistan industry performance. Further, the prevailing political and economic conditions in the country have made the business outlook very challenging, particularly for the textile sector, which is struggling to revive companies with old machine setups. The textile sector has major contribution of around 60 percent in country's exports and employment contribution of around 40 percent of the labor force. It also supports numerous other sectors such as cotton and retail through domestic linkages. In Pakistan, the discontinuation of regionally competitive energy pricing led to a substantial rise in production costs. Further, policy changes, high interest rates and delayed government refunds strained cash flows, all these factors are leading to an increase in the cost of doing business resultantly undermining our cost competitiveness with regional competitors by ending the profitability of Pakistan textile industry.

### **Operating results (Factory Shutdown):**

Company's operational sales for the period remained nil due to closure of operations. The Company, for the time being, has suspended its manufacturing operations since August 2016 which could not be resumed due to adverse scenario faced by the industry and working capital constraints.

The auditors of the Company have expressed adverse conclusion in their review report on going concern assumption due to closure of operations, default in repayment of installments of restructured liabilities and related non-provisioning of mark-up as explained in their review report.

The condensed interim financial statements have been prepared using going concern assumption as the company has approached its lenders for further restructuring of its liabilities without markup, which is in process. Management is hopeful that such revision will be finalized soon which will enable the company to resume its operations.

### **Future Outlook**

The country's long-term economic stability would largely depend on resolving fundamental economic issues, political firmness, proactive & prudent monetary policy, a sound & rationalized policy of the government for taxes, constant supply of utilities at affordable tariff and availability of cost-effective borrowing facilities. In this context, it is important to recognize the criticality of facilitating the export industries including textile which result in net inflow of dollars and foster economic stability.

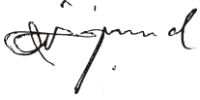

**REVIEW REPORT ON REVIEW OF INTERIM FINANCIAL STATEMENTS**  
**INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REVIEW REPORT**  
**TO THE MEMBERS OF DEWAN KHALID TEXTILE MILLS LIMITED**

**Introduction**

We have reviewed the accompanying Condensed interim Statement of financial Position of Dewan Khalid Textile Mills Limited ("the company") as at December 31, 2024 and the related Condensed interim statement of profit or loss, Condensed interim statement of comprehensive income, Condensed interim Statement of cash flow, Condensed interim statement of changes in equity and the notes to the Condensed interim financial statements for the six months period then ended (hereinafter referred to as the "interim financial statements"). Management is responsible for the preparation and Presentation of this condensed interim financial statement in accordance with approved accounting and reporting standards as applicable in Pakistan for interim financial reporting. Our responsibility is to express a conclusion on these interim financial statements based on our review.

**Scope of Review**

We conducted our review in accordance with the International Standard on review engagements 2410, "Review of interim financial Information performed by the independent Auditor of the Entity". A review of interim financial statements consists of making inquiries, primarily of persons responsible for financial and accounting matters, and applying analytical and other review procedures. A review is substantially less in scope than an audit conducted in accordance with International Standards on Auditing and consequently does not enable us to obtain assurance that we would become aware of all significant matters that might be identified in an audit. Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion.

**Basis of Adverse Conclusion**

- a) The Condensed interim financial statements of the company for the six months ended December 31, 2024 as disclosed in note 2 to the condensed interim financial Statements reflect loss after taxation of Rs. 17.925 (December 31, 2023: Rs. 20.026) million and as of that date it has accumulated losses of Rs. 918.676 (June 30, 2024: Rs. 905.101) million and its current liabilities exceeded its current assets by Rs.701.201 (June 30, 2024 Rs. 695.723) million without providing markups of Restructured and other liabilities and as refer in below para (b). The operations of the company were closed from August 2016 due to working capital constraints. Furthermore, the company defaulted in repayments of installments of restructured liabilities and short-term finance facilities have expired and not been renewed by banks amounting to Rs. 403.90 million, hence as per the terms of the restructuring under clause 10.2 of the compromise agreement the entire restructured debt amounting to Rs. 104.008 million along with mark up of Rs. 85.516 million (eligible for waiver outstanding as of date of restructuring) have immediately become payable therefore provision for markup should be made in these financial statements. Moreover, certain lenders are in litigation with the company, the aggregate suit amount is Rs.275.008 million (the company have also not provided markup on the same Loan). Further, one of the lenders have also filed winding up petition also some of the financial Institutions filed suit for execution of consent decree. Accordingly, the financial institutions have not provided bank confirmations as at reporting date. These conditions lead us to believe that the going concern assumption used in preparation of these Condensed interim financial Statements is inappropriate; consequently, the assets and liabilities should have been stated at their realizable and settlement amounts respectively.

- b) In addition to above, since the proposal, has not been accepted so far and the lenders, instead of the accepting the restructuring Proposal, have preferred to filed suit against the company, therefore the provision of mark up should be made in the Condensed interim financial statements as fully disclosed in note 9 and preceding Para of the report to Condensed interim Financial Statements. Had the provisions for the mark up, as discussed in preceding paragraph (a) , been made in these financial statements, the loss after taxation would have been higher by Rs. 797.547 (June 30, 2024: Rs. 775.581) million and markup payable would have been higher and shareholders' equity would have been lower by Rs. Rs. 797.547 (June 30, 2024: Rs. 775.581) million.

**Matter of Emphasis**

We draw attention to Note 1.1 to the Financial Statements, which explains that the condensed interim Financial Statements for the period ended December 31, 2024 were approved by management on August 11, 2026, later than usual. Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.

**Adverse Conclusion**

Our review indicates that, because of the significance of the matter discussed in paragraph (a) coupled with financial impact of matter discussed in paragraph (b) above, these accompanying interim financial Statements as of and for the six months period ended December 31, 2024 is not prepared, in all material respects, in accordance with approved accounting and reporting standards as applicable in Pakistan for interim financial Reporting.

**Other matter**

The figures of the condensed interim statement of profit or loss and condensed interim statement of other comprehensive income and the notes forming part thereof for the quarters ended December 31, 2024 and December 31, 2023 have not been reviewed and we do not express a conclusion on them, we are required to review only the cumulative figures for the Six-month ended December 31, 2024.

**1 CORPORATE INFORMATION**

Dewan Khalid Textile Mills Limited (the Company) was incorporated in Pakistan, as a public limited company on April 03, 1978, under the Companies Act, 1913 (Now the Companies Act, 2017) and its shares are listed in Pakistan Stock Exchange Limited. The Principal activity of the Company is trading, manufacturing and sale of yarn. However, the Operations of the company are suspended since August 2016.

- 1.1** The preparation and presentation of these condensed interim Financial Statements has suffered delay due to the time taken for resolving the issues faced by the Management in respect of retrieving accounting data from the old and fire-stricken IT servers. However, the said data has been duly verified and reconciled before preparation of these condensed interim Financial Statements.

**The geographical Location and address of the company's business units, including mill/plant are as under:**

- Company's registered office is located at Dewan Centre, 3-A Lalazar, Beach Hotel Road, Karachi.
- Company's production plant is situated at G-11, S.I.T.E., Kotri, District Jamshoro, Sindh, Pakistan.

**2 GOING CONCERN ASSUMPTION**

These condensed interim financial statements of the company for the period ended 31 December, 2024 reflect that company has sustained a net loss after taxation of Rs.17.925 million (December 31 2023: Rs.20.026 million) and as of that date company has negative reserves of Rs. 783.676 (June 2024: Rs. 770.101) million which have eroded its equity. Further the company's short term borrowing facilities have expired and not been renewed. Company defaulted in repayment of its restructured liabilities due to liquidity crunch and working Capital Constraints as a result the Company, for the time being, has suspended its manufacturing operations since August 2016. Accordingly, the entire restructured liabilities along with markup eligible for waiver have become immediately repayable. These conditions indicate the existence of material uncertainty which may cast significant doubt about the company's ability to continue as a going concern, therefore the company may not be able to realize its assets and discharge its liabilities during the normal course of business.

These condensed interim financial statements have been prepared on going concern assumption as the Company approached its lenders for further restructuring of its liabilities which is in process. Company is hopeful that such restructuring will be effective soon and will further streamline the funding requirements of the Company which will ultimately help the management to resume the operations with optimum utilization of production capacity. As the conditions mentioned in the foregoing paragraph are temporary and would reverse therefore the preparation of the condensed interim financial statements using going concern assumption is justified.

**3 BASIS OF PREPARATION**

- 3.1** These condensed interim financial statements of the Company for the half year ended 31 December 2024 have been prepared in accordance with accounting and reporting standards as applicable in Pakistan for interim financial reporting. The accounting and reporting standards as applicable in Pakistan for interim financial reporting comprise of:

International Accounting Standard (IAS) 34, "Interim Financial Reporting", issued by the International Accounting Standards Board (IASB) as notified under the Companies Act, 2017: and

Provisions of and directives issued under the Companies Act, 2017.

Where the provisions of and directives issued under the Companies Act, 2017 differ with the requirements of IAS 34, the provisions of and directives issued under the Companies Act, 2017 have been followed.

- 3.2** These condensed interim financial statements do not include all the information and disclosures required in the annual audited financial statements, and should be read in conjunction with the Company's annual audited financial statements for the year ended 30 June 2024.
- 3.3** The figures included in the condensed interim statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income for the quarters ended 31 December 2024 and 31 December 2023 and the notes forming part thereof have not been

reviewed by the auditors of the Company, as they have reviewed the accumulated figures for the half years ended 31 December 2024.

#### 4 SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES AND ESTIMATES

**4.1** The accounting policies and methods of computation adopted in the preparation of these condensed interim financial information are consistent with those applied in the preparation of annual audited financial statements of the Company for the year ended 30 June 2024.

#### 4.2 Change in accounting standards, interpretations, and amendments to published accounting and reporting standards

##### 4.2.1 Amendments to published accounting and reporting standards that became effective during the period:

There were certain amendments to accounting and reporting standards which became mandatory for the Company during the period. However, the amendments did not have any significant impact on the financial reporting of the Company and, therefore, have not been disclosed in these condensed interim financial statements.

##### 4.2.2 Amendments to published accounting and reporting standards that are not yet effective:

There are certain amendments to the accounting and reporting standards that will be mandatory for the Company's annual accounting periods beginning on or after 1 July 2024. However, these amendments will not have any significant impact on the financial reporting of the Company and, therefore, have not been disclosed in these condensed interim financial statements.

#### 5 ACCOUNTING ESTIMATES, JUDGEMENTS AND FINANCIAL RISK MANAGEMENT

The preparation of interim financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amounts. Actual results may differ from these judgements, estimates and assumptions.

Judgements and estimates made by the management in the preparation of these condensed interim financial statements are the same as those applied in the Company's annual audited financial statements for the year ended 30 June 2024.

The Company's financial risk management objectives and policies are consistent with those disclosed in the Company's annual audited financial statements for the year ended 30 June 2024.

## 9 FINANCE COST

The company has not provided the markup on long term and short term borrowings for the half year ended on December 31, 2024 amounting to Rs. 21.966 on (Up to June 30, 2024: Rs. 775.581 million) in respect of borrowings of certain banks who have not yet accepted the restricting proposal. The Management of the company is quite hopeful that these banks will also accept restricting proposal in near future. Had the provision been made the loss for the first quarter would have been higher by Rs. 21.966 million and accrued mark-up would have been higher and shareholders' equity would have been lower by Rs. 797.547 million. The said non provisioning is departure from the requirement of IAS 23- 'Borrowing Costs'.

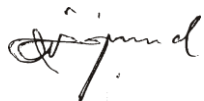

آپ کی کمپنی کے بورڈ آف ڈائریکٹرز 31 دسمبر 2024ء کو ختم ہونے والی ششماہی کے لئے کمپنیز ایکٹ 2017ء کے سیکشن 237 اور سیکورٹیز اینڈ ایکسچینج کمیشن آف پاکستان کے جاری کردہ کوڈ آف کارپوریٹ گورننس کی تعمیل کرتے ہوئے غیر میعاد عبوری مالیاتی حسابات پیش کرنے پر خوشی محسوس کر رہے ہیں۔

### معیشت اور صنعت کا پس منظر:

پاکستان کی معیشت کو درپیش جاری اقتصادی دباؤ کے باعث پاکستان کی صنعتی کارکردگی پر منفی اثرات مرتب ہوتے رہے۔ مزید برآں، ملک میں موجودہ سیاسی اور اقتصادی حالات نے کاروباری منظر نامے کو بہت مشکل بنا دیا ہے، خصوصاً ٹیکسٹائل کے شعبے کے لیے، جو پرانے مشینی اسٹرکچر والی کمپنیوں کی بحالی میں مشکلات کا سامنا کر رہا ہے۔ ملک کی برآمدات میں ٹیکسٹائل سیکٹر تقریباً 60 فیصد اور محنت کش طبقے میں روزگار کی فراہمی میں تقریباً 40 فیصد حصہ رکھتا ہے۔ یہ شعبہ ملکی سطح پر کپاس اور ریٹیل سمیت متعدد دیگر صنعتوں کی بھی معاونت کرتا ہے۔ پاکستان میں خطے کے مطابق مسابقتی توانائی قیمتوں کے خاتمے سے پیداواری لاگت میں نمایاں اضافہ ہوا۔ مزید برآں، پالیسی میں تبدیلیوں، بلند شرح سود اور حکومت کی جانب سے ریفرنڈم میں تاخیر نے کیش فلو کو متاثر کیا۔ ان تمام عوامل کے نتیجے میں کاروباری لاگت میں اضافہ ہو رہا ہے، جس سے پاکستان کی ٹیکسٹائل صنعت کی منافع بخشی ختم ہو رہی ہے اور یہ شعبہ خطے کے حریف ممالک کے مقابلے میں اپنی لاگت کے لحاظ سے مسابقت کھو رہا ہے۔

### مالیاتی نتائج اور کارکردگی: (پیداوار معطل)

پیداوار معطل ہونے کی وجہ سے اس ششماہی میں بھی کمپنی کی صافی پیداواری فروخت صفر رہی۔ کمپنی نے وقتی طور پر اگست 2016ء سے اپنی پیداوار کے عمل کو معطل کر دیا ہے جو کہ صنعت میں نا مساعد مشکلات اور کام چلانے کے لیے سرمایہ میں کمی کی وجہ سے ہے۔

کمپنی کے آڈیٹرز نے آپریشن کی بندش، قرضہ جات کی قسطوں کی ادائیگی اور مارک اپ سے متعلق غیر عدم فراہمی اور مشکوک قرضوں کے لئے فراہمی جو کہ ان کی جائزہ رپورٹ میں بیان کیا گیا ہے، کے باعث مستقبل کی تشویش سے متعلق اپنی جائزہ رپورٹ میں منفی نتیجہ کا اظہار کیا ہے۔

مجموعی عبوری مالی بیانات تشویش کا اظہار کرتے ہوئے تیار کیئے گئے ہیں کیونکہ کمپنی نے اپنے قرض دہندگان سے اپنی ذمہ داریوں کی بلا سود مزید تنظیم نو کے لئے رابطہ کیا ہے جو کہ جاری ہے۔ انتظامیہ کو امید ہے کہ جلد ہی اس طرح کی نظر ثانی کو حتمی شکل دے دی جائے گی جس سے کمپنی اپنے آپریٹرز دوبارہ شروع کر سکے گی۔

### مستقبل کا نظریہ:
