ISSI holds annual dialogue with Iranian think-tank IPIS

Institutional cooperation, stronger bilateral ties Pak-Iran reaffirmed

The Institute of Strategic Studies Islamabad (ISSI) and Iran's Institute for Political and International Studies (IPIS) held Annual Dialogue on bilateral and regional issues on Wednesday.

The Centre for Afghanistan, Middle East & Africa (CAMEA) had organized the dialogue. Among those who participated in this two-nation dialogue were Dr. Muhammad Hassan Shaykh al-Islami, Deputy Foreign Minister of Iran and President IPIS; Ambassador Sohail Mahmood, Director General ISSI; Dr. Omid Babelian, Research Fellow IPIS; Amina Khan, Director CAMEA, Ambassador Hamid Reza Arshadi, Senior Research Fellow, IPIS, Ambassador Riffat

Masood, Former Ambassador of Pakistan to Iran; and Ambassador Khalid Mahmood, Chairman ISSI.

The dialogue was divided into three working sessions. The first session was titled "Pakistan-Iran Bilateral Relations", moderated by Ms. Amina Khan, Director CAMEA. The second session was titled "Changing Dynamics in the Middle East: Prospects for Regional Integration and Connectivity" and was moderated by Arhama Siddiq, RF CAMEA. The third session was titled "The Evolving Situation in Afghanistan" and was moderated by Sarah Akram, RF CAMEA.

In the Inaugural Session, Director General ISSI Ambassador Sohail Mahmood and Deputy Foreign Minister/President IPIS Dr. Muhammad Hassan Shaykh al-Islami, made opening statements --noting the

unprecedented flux, fragility and polarization in the global environment and the profound changes taking place at the international and regional levels.

He underscored the importance of close Pakistan-Iran consultations in this milieu and expressed satisfaction at the positive trajectory of the bilateral relationship. The two principals also exchanged perspectives on the situation in Afghanistan and the tragedy unfolding in Palestine. They underscored the need for the world community's urgent intervention to stop unabated oppression against Palestinian civilian population and provide immediate relief assistance. The proactive role of the UN and OIC in ensuring urgent action to address the current unacceptable situation was emphasised.

Ambassador Sohail Mahmood and Dr. Shaykh al-Islami also underscored the value attached to the institutional relationship between ISSI and IPIS and reaffirmed their commitment to intensify mutual exchanges and expand the scope of mutual collaboration between the two think-tanks.

During the first working session, speakers highlighted recent progress in the Pakistan-Iran bilateral relationship, including bilateral trade surpassing \$2 billion, despite the challenge of sanctions. Collaboration on opening border crossings, opening of border market and importance of Iran-Pakistan Pipeline (IPI) gas were further highlighted. Pakistan-Iran mutual cooperation collaboration in ECO, SCO, OIC, UN and other multilateral fora was also positively evaluated.

Cataract patients increasing with population growth

With the rising population and an increase in average age, the number of cataract patients was increasing rapidly in the country, said Al-Shifa Trust Eye Hospital here on Wednesday.

Brig. (R) Prof. Dr Sa-

biuddin, Head of the Cataract Department of Al-Shifa Trust Eye Hospital talking to the media said that the rate of disease was also scaling up with the upsurge of diabetes people.

He informed that cataract was an age-related degeneration and could be controlled with surgery. Dr Sabiuddin advised the government to come forward and strengthen the eye departments in all state-run hospitals, including those established at the district level, as the increasing number of patients cannot be handled by the current facilities.

He advised that it should be operated only when it matures and eye-sight becomes too low to perform normal activities. However, he added that before deciding on cataract surgery, an opinion from an ophthalmologist must be sought.

He informed that Al-Shifa Trust Eye Hospital has thirty air-conditioned operation theatres, twenty-five expert doctors, six anaesthetists, and state-of-the-art diagnostic facilities while around 90 to 100 surgeries were performed daily. He added that surgical camps were frequently organized in the far-flung areas under the outreach programme and almost 100 surgeries were conducted on a daily basis.

Pakistan best option for CARs for sea trade

"Pakistan provides the best possible route for the Central Asian states to reach the warm waters of the Arabian Sea for their trade," said Dr Adam Saud, the Dean of the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences at the Bahria University. He was speaking at a roundtable on developing relations between Afghanistan and Central Asia organized by the Institute of Regional Studies (IRS) here on Wednesday.

Dr Saud was of the view that the Central Asian Republics (CARs) could not use the Iranian route for their trade through the warm waters of the Persian Gulf and the Arabian Sea because of the Western sanctions against Iran. He added, however, that Afghanistan will continue to remain a source of concern in terms of trade connectivity for CARs because of the likelihood of terrorist violence in Afghanistan and the country's poor physical and institutional infrastructure.

Crackdown on overpricing vendors, six arrested

In a crackdown on commodities overpricing, the Assistant Commissioner of Pothohar Awdalrshad Bhatti, visited the vegetable market area and arrested six vendors for selling vegetables at higher than government notified rates.

The Assistant Commissioner also inspected the area to ensure that all vendors were complying with the government rates and selling items at wholesale rates. Warnings were issued to other violators. This crackdown is a welcome move, as it will help to ensure that consumers are not overcharged for vegetables. It is also a reminder to vendors that they must comply with the government rates.

Moreover, Assistant Commissioner (Secretariat), Aneel Saeed, along with Traffic Police, inspected different markets to check the price of essential items, use of unauthorized plastic bags, and the high fares at public transport.

The AC, following the directions of the Deputy Commissioner Islamabad Irfan Nawaz Memon, inspected intra and inter-city vehicles to check the revised and reduced fares and issued challans to those violating the government rates.
